THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (hereinafter referred to as “**MOU**”) is made this 7th day of February 2017.

UNIVERSITI MALAYSIA SARAWAK (hereinafter referred to as “**UNIMAS**”), an institution of higher learning established under the Universities and University Colleges Act 1971 whose address is at Universiti Malaysia Sarawak, Jalan Dato Musa, 94300 Kota Samarahan, Sarawak, Malaysia which for the purpose of this MoU is represented by **FACULTY OF ECONOMICS AND BUSINESS** and shall include its lawful representatives and permitted assigns of the one part;

AND

SCHOOL OF ECONOMICS INDONESIA SURABAYA (hereinafter referred to as “**STIESIA**”), an institution of higher learning business study established under the PERPENDIKNAS Foundation 1972 whose address is at Jalan Menur Pumpungan 30 Surabaya which for the purpose of this MOU is represented by Chairman of STIESIA and shall include its lawful representatives and permitted assigns of the other part;

(hereinafter referred to singularly as “**the Party**” and collectively as “**the Parties**”),

WHEREAS

- A. **UNIMAS** is an established University which strives to enhance and strengthen its research capabilities and has taken various initiatives to complement its educational excellence. **UNIMAS** has entered into various collaborative arrangements with other parties to enhance research, consultancy and academia.
- B. **STIESIA** is a private university focused on business science. In a response of increasing the need of business-skilled employee, **STIESIA** are engaged with innovation teaching of ideas on modern business, and applied research that pushes forward the frontier of knowledge in accounting and management.

- C. The Parties are desirous of entering into this Memorandum of Understanding to declare their respective intentions and to establish a basis of co-operation and collaboration between the Parties upon the terms as contained herein.

HAVE REACHED AN UNDERSTANDING as follows:

ARTICLE I

OBJECTIVE

The Parties, subject to the terms of this Memorandum of Understanding and the laws, rules, regulations and national policies from time to time in force in each Party's country, will endeavour to strengthen, promote and develop co-operation between the Parties on the basis of equality and mutual benefit.

ARTICLE II

AREAS OF CO-OPERATION

1. Each Party will, subject to the laws, rules, regulations and national policies from time to time in force, governing the subject matter in herein , endeavour to take necessary steps to encourage and promote co-operation in the following areas:
 - (a) Knowledge sharing through active participation using various platforms (seminar, conference, workshop etc.) related to teaching, research and administration that can mutually benefit both institutions;
 - (b) Collaborate in joint-research papers in relevant areas that can enhance visibility of both institutions; and/or

- (c) Any other areas of co-operation to be mutually agreed upon by the Parties.
2. For the purpose of implementing the co-operation in respect of any areas stated in paragraph 1 the parties will enter into a separate legally binding agreement subject to terms and conditions as mutually agreed upon by the Parties including clauses on “confidentiality”, “suspension”, “protection of intellectual property rights” and “settlement of dispute” as contained in Annexure 1 of this Memorandum of Understanding.

ARTICLE III

FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

1. This Memorandum of Understanding will not give rise to any financial obligation by one Party to other.
2. Each Party will bear its own cost and expenses in relation to this Memorandum of Understanding.

ARTICLE IV

EFFECT OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding serves only as a record of the Parties' intentions and does not constitute or create, and is not intended to constitute or create, obligations under domestic or international law and will not give rise to any legal process and will not be deemed to constitute or create any legally binding or enforceable obligations, express or implied.

ARTICLE V

NO AGENCY

Nothing contained herein is to be construed so as to constitute a joint venture partnership or formal business organization of any kind between the Parties or so to constitute either Party as the agent of the other.

ARTICLE VI

ENTRY INTO EFFECT AND DURATION

1. This Memorandum of Understanding will come into effect on the date of signing and will remain in effect for a period of **five (5)** years or until termination by either party with **three (3)** months written notice.
2. This Memorandum of Understanding may be extended for a further period as may be agreed in writing by the Parties by issuance to the other Party of a written notice signifying its intention to renew or further the period not less than **three (3)** months prior to the Expiry Date.

ARTICLE VII







For purposes of paragraph 1 above, such documents, information and data include any document, information and data which is disclosed by a Party (the Disclosing party) to the other Party (the Receiving party) prior to, or after, the execution of this Memorandum of Agreement, involving technical, business, marketing, policy, know-how, planning, project management and other documents, information, data and/or solutions in any form, including but not limited to any document, information or data which is designated in writing to be confidential or by its nature intended to be for the knowledge of the Receiving party or if orally given, is given in the circumstances of confidence.
3. Both Parties agree that the provisions of this Article shall continue to be binding between the Parties notwithstanding the termination of this Memorandum of Agreement.





Rajamangala University of Technology Krungthep (UTK), Bangkok, Thailand and Sekolah Tinggi Ilmu Ekonomi Indonesia (STIESIA) agree to cooperate on academic programs based on the principles of equality and reciprocity, fairness and voluntariness, as well as honesty and faithfulness, and to abide by the laws and regulations of the Kingdom of Thailand and of the Republic of Indonesia.

This MOU aims at reaching mutual understanding and promoting scholar and student exchanges, and sharing of academic information and material. UTK and STIESIA agree to establish formal communicative and cooperative relations and agree on the following items:

1. Both parties agree to promote the following exchange programs based on their respective academic and educational needs.
 - a. Joint research activities and academic programs;
 - b. Exchange of faculty members for the development of both parties;
 - c. Exchange of undergraduate and postgraduate students for short courses program and mobility program for 1 semester;
 - d. Joint collaboration in organizing symposium or conferences; and
 - e. Joint collaboration in publication
 - f. Joint training programs
 - g. Other international cooperative and exchange programs that may be agreed upon by both parties.
2. The implementation of each program of this MOU shall be negotiated and determined by both parties. For issues not stipulated in the MOU, the parties may signed a supplemental agreement (annex), which then would form a part of this MOU
3. The full autonomy of either party shall not be diminished, nor shall any contains be imposed on carrying out this MOU.
4. This MOU shall be in force for five years, and shall be subject to revision or extension by mutual agreement. This MOU may be terminated by either university by written notice of no less than six months prior to desired termination date
5. This MOU is written in English, and shall come into effect from the last date of signing. Each university shall retain one copy with both signatures.

Pursuant to the spirit of the cooperative relationship between International College of Rajamangala University of Technology Krungthep (IC-UTK) AND Sekolah Tinggi Ilmu Ekonomi Indonesia (STIESIA) Surabaya AND within the framework of the existing Memorandum of Understanding,

IT is the intention and purpose of this bilateral agreement to provide pertinent information regarding programs of reciprocal sit in and exchange student.

THIS ANNEX, along with its attached exhibits (if any), will describe the particulars of the details and responsibilities of both parties.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF EACH UNIVERSITY

1. IC-UTK and STIESIA will provide each other with:
 - a. Pertinent information of academic programs, to include curriculum and study plans for the eligible exchange students.
 - b. Sit in Student / Exchange students application forms
 - c. Cost information regarding additional school fees, and estimated costs for living expenses, such as housing, food, books, extraneous activities, and miscellaneous living expenses.

2. Nomination and selection of students:

Students will be informed of this program by the home university, who will then apply to the host university by way of submitting an application form. All forms will then be considered, reviewed, and evaluated by the host university's pertinent office, committee, or persons, who shall have final approval of the applicant's eligibility, based on the university's admissions criteria.

3. The universities will provide accepted students with orientation information prior to their arrival to the host university.

4. Visa Information – the universities will provide to exchange students:
 - a. Letters of acceptance and other documentation in order to apply for a study visa
 - b. Specific visa information at orientation meetings
 - c. Documentation and ongoing assistance for visa renewal.

5. Learning Agreement – to formalize and effectuate the student’s exchange program, the home university will send to the host university a LEARNING AGREEMENT, listing:
 - a. The student’s personal details
 - b. The student’s preferred choices of courses to be studied.
 - c. Acknowledgement and approval of the exchange by both universities.
 - d. It is the responsibility of the home university to determine the acceptability of the course offerings and the validity of credit transfer to the student’s home university.
 - e. The learning agreement shall be signed by the student, and signed by appropriate representatives of the home university (stamped with the university seal), and the host university (stamped with the university seal).

6. Transcripts – the host university will provide the transcript of the exchange student’s study results within 21 days of the last day of the semester attended by the student.

7. Housing placement: the universities shall provide information, advice, and assistance to the exchange student regarding housing accommodation.

8. The universities shall determine the persons and channels of communication regarding:
 - a. Application and acceptance
 - b. Funding/financials
 - c. Ongoing progress reports and grade results
 - d. Emergency information

9. Student insurance requirements
 If the exchange student is required to have accident and health insurance, such information shall be sent to the appropriate university office.

10. Adherence to university policy
 Students must agree to comply with the host university’s policies and regulations regarding admission, maintenance of student status, and code of behavior.

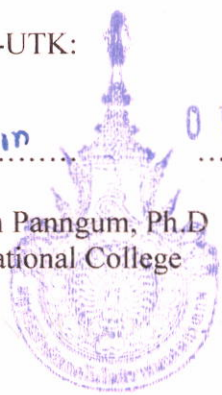

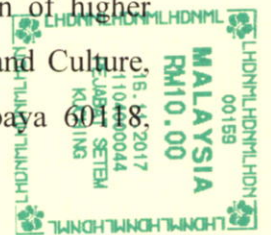

THIS STUDENT EXCHANGE AGREEMENT (hereinafter referred to as “**The Agreement**”) is made on day of **19 6 NOV 2017** 2017.

BETWEEN

SCHOOL OF ECONOMICS INDONESIA SURABAYA an institution of higher learning established on 20th April 1972 under the Ministry of Education and Culture Indonesia, whose address is at Jalan Menur Pumpungan No. 30, Surabaya 60148, Indonesia (hereinafter referred to as “**STIESIA**”) of the one party;



AND

UNIVERSITI MALAYSIA SARAWAK an institution of higher learning established under the Universities and University Colleges Act 1971 whose address is at Universiti Malaysia Sarawak, 94300 Kota Samarahan, Sarawak, Malaysia (“**UNIMAS**”) of the other party.

WHEREAS:

A Memorandum of Understanding between Universiti Malaysia Sarawak, Malaysia, and School of Economics Indonesia Surabaya (STIESIA) has been signed on 7th February 2017. Among the objectives of the Memorandum Of Understanding is to share the knowledge and expertise, in various platform including teaching and learning that can be useful to both institution.

In accordance with Article II, 1 (a) in the Memorandum of Understanding between Universiti Malaysia Sarawak, Malaysia, and School of Economics Indonesia Surabaya (STIESIA), the two universities agree to exchange students as follows:

Article 1

This Agreement covers the exchange of undergraduate and graduate students which will occur on a regular basis.

Article 2

Unless otherwise defined, "exchange" shall mean a one-for-one exchange of students from each university; "exchange students" shall mean students participating in the exchange implemented herein; "sending university" shall mean the student's home university from which he or she intends to graduate; and "receiving university" shall mean the university that has agreed to receive the exchange students from the sending university.

Article 3

Suitable candidates for exchange programs will be recommended by the sending university. The receiving university will review their academic records and recommendations to determine their eligibility for a particular program. The sending university is responsible for informing their Exchange Students of the terms of this Agreement as they apply to the Exchange Students.

Article 4

Both universities agree to only accept students who do not seek degrees at the receiving university.

Article 5

Expenses incurred by exchange students in programs under this Agreement, except for expenses covered by Article 6, will be borne by the individual student.

Article 6

The receiving university will waive application, registration and tuition fees.

Article 7

The Agreement allows up to five (5) students to study at the receiving university for a period of one (1) semester (six (6) months) in this academic year. Both universities will review the program annually for any imbalances in the number of exchange students and make an effort to maintain a reasonable balance in the number of exchange students. Both universities will endeavor to make the number of exchange students equal by the end of the Agreement.

Article 8

Prospective exchange students must satisfy the language proficiency requirements of their course of studies. Prospective exchange students who apply to study at the undergraduate level and must have completed at least one (1) year of continuous study at the sending university before being admitted to the exchange program. Prospective exchange students who apply to study at the graduate level must have completed at least one (1) semester of graduate studies before being admitted to the exchange program. Exchange students are expected to return to the sending university upon completion of the exchange program.

Article 9

The sending university will recognize credits, awarded by the receiving university according to the regulations and practices of the sending university.

Article 10

Each university will, within the limits of their resources, assist exchange students covered under the terms of this Agreement in securing accommodations and in achieving their study and research goals.

Article 11

Exchange students are required to carry adequate insurance, such as medical, hospitalization, public liability insurance, and to provide proof to the host university upon arrival.

Article 12

This Agreement takes effect when it is signed by both parties. The Agreement is to remain in effect for five (5) years from the date it is signed. The Agreement may be extended by mutual written consent of both parties.

Article 13

Any intellectual property rights owned by the university before the date of this Agreement and during the term of this Agreement will remain the property of that university. Nothing contained in this Agreement will affect the absolute ownership rights of any university in such university's intellectual property rights. For the avoidance of doubt, no licenses are granted under this Agreement.

In the event that either university wishes to use the name and/or logo of the other university for any purposes, including without limitation for the purposes of marketing or recruitment, such university shall obtain the written consent of the other university in advance of such use.

Neither of the university shall publish any institutional marketing material (excluding student testimonials and related documentation) relating to this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other university and undertake that the wording for any such marketing materials shall be agreed jointly between the university prior to its use.

Article 14

Neither party shall be liable for any unforeseeable event beyond its reasonable control not caused by the fault or negligence of such party, which causes such party to be unable to perform its obligations under this Agreement, and which it has been unable to overcome by the exercise of due diligence. If any force majeure delays or prevents the performance of the obligations of either party for a continuous period in excess of thirty (30) days, the party not so affected may give notice to the affected party to terminate this Agreement specifying the date on which termination this Agreement specifying the date on which termination will take effect.

The failure of either Institution at any time to enforce any of the provisions of this Agreement or exercise any right under this Agreement shall not operate as a waiver of that right or preclude the exercise or enforcement of it at any time or times thereafter.

Article 15

The Agreement may be modified by mutual written consent of both parties. No modification, variation or amendment of this Agreement shall have any legal effect and force unless such modification, variation or amendment is in writing and executed by the parties.

Article 16

The Agreement may be terminated by either university with notification to the other party at least six (6) months prior to the effective date of termination. The termination of the Agreement will not affect the terms of activities ongoing at the time of notification of termination unless otherwise agreed between the parties.

Article 17

The failure of either university at any time to enforce any of the provisions of this Agreement or exercise any right under this Agreement shall not operate as a waiver of that right or preclude the exercise or enforcement of it at any time or times thereafter.

Article 18

This Agreement shall not be assignable to any other parties by either university.

Article 19

Both universities shall attempt to resolve in good faith any dispute or claim in connection with this Agreement promptly and amicably through negotiations between them.

Article 20

If any provision of this Agreement is held by a court or other competent authority to be unlawful, void or unenforceable, it shall be deemed to be severed from this Agreement and shall be of no force and effect and this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect as if such provision had not originally been contained in this Agreement. In the event of any such severance the Parties shall negotiate in good faith in order to agree the terms of a mutually acceptable and satisfactory alternative provision in place of the provision so severed.

Article 21

This Agreement is governed by and construed in accordance with the law of Malaysia and under Court of Malaysia Jurisdiction.

Article 22

Time wherever mentioned in this agreement shall be of the essence of this Agreement.

THIS LECTURER EXCHANGE AGREEMENT (hereinafter referred to as “The Agreement”) is made on 2nd June 2018.

BETWEEN

SCHOOL OF ECONOMICS INDONESIA SURABAYA a higher institution established on 20th April 1972 under the Ministry of Education and Culture, Indonesia, whose address is at Jalan Menur Pumpungan No. 30, Surabaya 60118, Indonesia (hereinafter referred to as “**STIESIA**”) of the one party;

AND

UNIVERSIDADE DA PAZ a higher institution established in March 2004 by *Neon Metin Foundation*, whose address is Av. Osindo I Manleuana, Dili, Timor Leste(hereinafter referred to as “**UNPAZ**”) of the other party.

WHEREAS

A Memorandum of Understanding between School of Economics Indonesia Surabaya, Indonesia, and UniversidadeDa Paz (UNPAZ) has been signed in Dili, Timor Leste, on 9th March 2017 (No. A672/01.6e/III/2017 and No. 103/UNPAZ/III/2017). Among the objectives of the memorandum of Understanding is to hold an agreement in the field of education that can be useful for both parties. Therefore, both universities agree to **exchange lecturers**with some considerations as follow:

Article 1

In this agreement unless the content shall otherwise imply, “exchange” shall mean an exchange of lecturer each university. “Exchange lecturer” shall mean a faculty member with teaching responsibilities. “Home institution” shall mean the university of which an exchange lecturer is on the faculty and “host institution” shall mean the university that has agreed to receive an exchange lecturer from the home institution.

Article 2

This agreement covers the exchange of lecturers for teaching activity in regular basis. The length of stay in this exchange program shall be a period of one semester in one academic year. Both universities will review the program annually and endeavor to make the number of exchange lecturers equally.

Article3

Each party shall pay the salaries and benefits of its own exchange lecturer participating in the exchange program. Moreover all travel and living expenses shall be borne by the home institution. While the host institution agrees to assist exchange lecturer locating suitable accommodation.

Article 4

The exchange lecturers must have medical insurance coverage for the duration of the entire exchange as required by the host institution and host country regulations. The host institution shall have no responsibility or liability for providing health care services or health care insurance for exchange lecturers.

Article 5

Neither party shall be liable for failure or delay in the performance of any duties under this agreement when such delay or failure is due to causes beyond the party's control that could not have been avoided by the exercise of due care, including, but not limited to, acts of God; natural disasters; riots; war; epidemics; terrorist activities; government restrictions; failure of suppliers, subcontractors, or carriers; or the like. The impacted party shall give the other party notice of the failure or delay as soon as possible.

Article 6

This agreement takes effect when it is signed by both parties. The agreement is to remain in effect for five (5) years from the date it is signed. The agreement may be extended by mutual written consent of both parties. Otherwise, this agreement may be terminated by either party giving written notice to the other party at least 180 days in advance of the stated termination date. Termination of this agreement shall not affect activities in progress pursuant to specific activity agreements, which shall continue until concluded by the parties in accordance with their terms or as otherwise agreed to by the parties in writing.

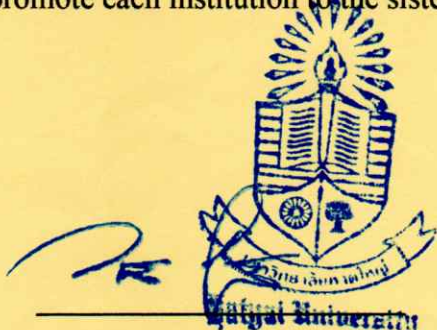



1. Exchange of faculty, scholars, and students for the purpose of lecture, study, research, internship, and/or attend conferences and seminars.

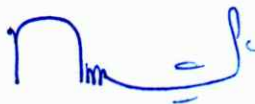
